The Bylaws changes I referenced at our meeting for your consideration, are as follows:

Article 4: membership and dues-section 4 currently reads:

The proposed change is as follows:

Guests are welcome to attend the monthly general meetings and either pay the required guest fee or present a Crazy Quilters business card with a member's name on the back, entitling them to one free meeting. Guests are also welcome to attend, at a member's invitation, annual events and monthly meetings.

Section 6: Dues (of the same article)
Bullet C currently reads:

The proposed change is as follows:

If a member joins the guild between January 1 and September 30, the full membership fee is payable to the guild. If someone joins after September 30, they pay the following year's dues and get November and December as a bonus.
