PHILANTHROPY NOTES - Donna Karbach FABRIC DONATION



On February 11th, Brenda and I walked across the parking lot from the quilting room to pick up Phyllis Gray's fabrics and batting stash which she had beautifully displayed and sorted by color.

We loaded up my red wagon and brought everything to the quilting room where Gigi and Betty helped us sort and select fabric that would be usable for quilting and stored large pieces in the cabinet.

In exchange for the donation, we agreed to have a beautiful hand-quilted wedding ring quilt Phyllis made bound and returned to her. Betty Khzouz agreed to do the binding and we returned the bound quilt to Phyllis on March 2nd. As you can see, Phyllis was thrilled to finally be able to use this quilt!

PLACEMATS FOR MEALS ON WHEELS



On February 10th, Frances Nuelle told us about a request from Meals on Wheels Orange County for 180 placemats for their clients to be delivered with Easter Dinners. Of course, we Said Yes to the Project!

From the fabric and batting donated by Phyllis, we made placemat kits. Our quilters, in collaboration with the Sewing Supers and residents who use the sewing room at Clubhouse 4, met that goal and completed all 180 placemats!

CHEMO QUILTS FOR MEMORIAL CARE

Julia Lieberman, Director, Volunteer Services, reported that the quilts were "very well received, and the infusion center would be happy to take some more. Also, the Blood Donor Center would be happy to have some to give to their donors. Many, many thanks to your group."

CHEMO QUILTS FOR CITY OF HOPE

Gigi suggested I inquire about donating chemo quilts to the new cancer treatment center in Irvine called City of Hope. I contacted them and received the following response:

"Your offer to donate the chemo quilts has been approved! Our Patient and Family Resource Center would like to receive up to 130 chemo quilts."

There is no due date for this project and they don't all have to be completed at once. But, judging by the enthusiasm and speed with which the placemats were made, I don't think we will have any problem fulfilling this request. Also, I have two suggestions to facilitate this project: Use inexpensive fleece instead of backing and batting and make this our project for Newbie Quilting Days.

NEWBIE QUILTING DAYS

March is National Quilting Month, the perfect time to have our first Newbie Quilting Bee on Monday, March 28th!

Each person who agreed to be a tutor should let me know they are planning to participate so I can create a sign-up sheet, then choose fabric and make a kit for a super simple quilt. For the kits, I suggest alternating blocks of large print fabric with four-patches or Disappearing Nine-Patch kits. Any pattern with alternating solid blocks and blocks with only 2- to 4-part blocks will be easy and quick to complete.

Per the chart below, using 10-inch blocks, only 35 blocks are needed for a Chemo Quilt, fewer if borders are added. This will be a perfect project for Newbies. Then, rather than using backing and batting, we will use fleece, sew around edges, turn inside out and quilt something like a simple "X" like we did for the place mats. These quilts will be warm and comforting for the patients.

If this event is successful, we will advertise the next Newbie Quilting Bee in the Globe and the Village Recreation Department will publicize this event and invite our neighbors.

March Educational Tidbits Mona Bonbright A FREE SHAMROCK PATTERN
