Laguna Woods quilters and sewers have joined forces again to complete 186 of the 200 pillowcases to be gifted to Orange County foster children at CASA's Christmas party. Besides being used in their bed, a pillowcase may be the only way a foster child can carry his or her belongings from one home to another. We are confident we will reach our goal of 200 and will continue to make pillowcases for donations to other organizations.

Our Programs VP, David Cavanaugh, is a CASA volunteer and suggested this project. A CASA volunteer is designated by a judge to work in the best interests of children who have been victimized by abuse or neglect. The CASA will assist victimized children by working to provide them with a stable network of support and advocacy that they may otherwise not have access too. Ideally, a CASA can work to keep the child from being put under too much pressure from the unpredictable vacuum of social services and foster homes. It is common for troubled children without proper support systems to "fall through the cracks" and be left at the mercy of group homes that subject them to unchecked abuse. With a CASA in place, however, some of these children might be able to be helped before the worst case scenario comes to pass.

Over 50 cuddle/chemo/comfort quilts have also been completed and we have 30 kits ready to be sewn. These will be distributed to several charities, including CASA, Orange County Rescue Mission, chemo centers, veterans and through Laguna Woods Social Services. Brenda Rader has confirmed that in person visits are being made again, so we will be adding wheelchair quilts to our "To Do" list as well.

FIREFIGHTER QUILTS



Thanks to Betty Khzouz, Babs Schwartz and Donna Karbach, who together have made 7 quilts so far! Our goal is to gift one quilt to each of the 39 Firefighters our local OCFA Station 22 by the next International Firefighters Day, May 4, 2023. We have plenty of fabric, batting and backing for our members to use, and Donna has offered to quilt the firefighter quilts. The quilts do not have to be complicated. We're looking forward to watching the thermometer

rise as we make more quilts to reach our goal!


<u>Seller numbers will be assigned at the meeting next week.</u> If you can't be at the meeting, please let Me know. As a reminder, if you are selling, you are working!
