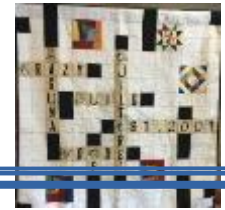

Technique demonstrations are hosted at several tables.

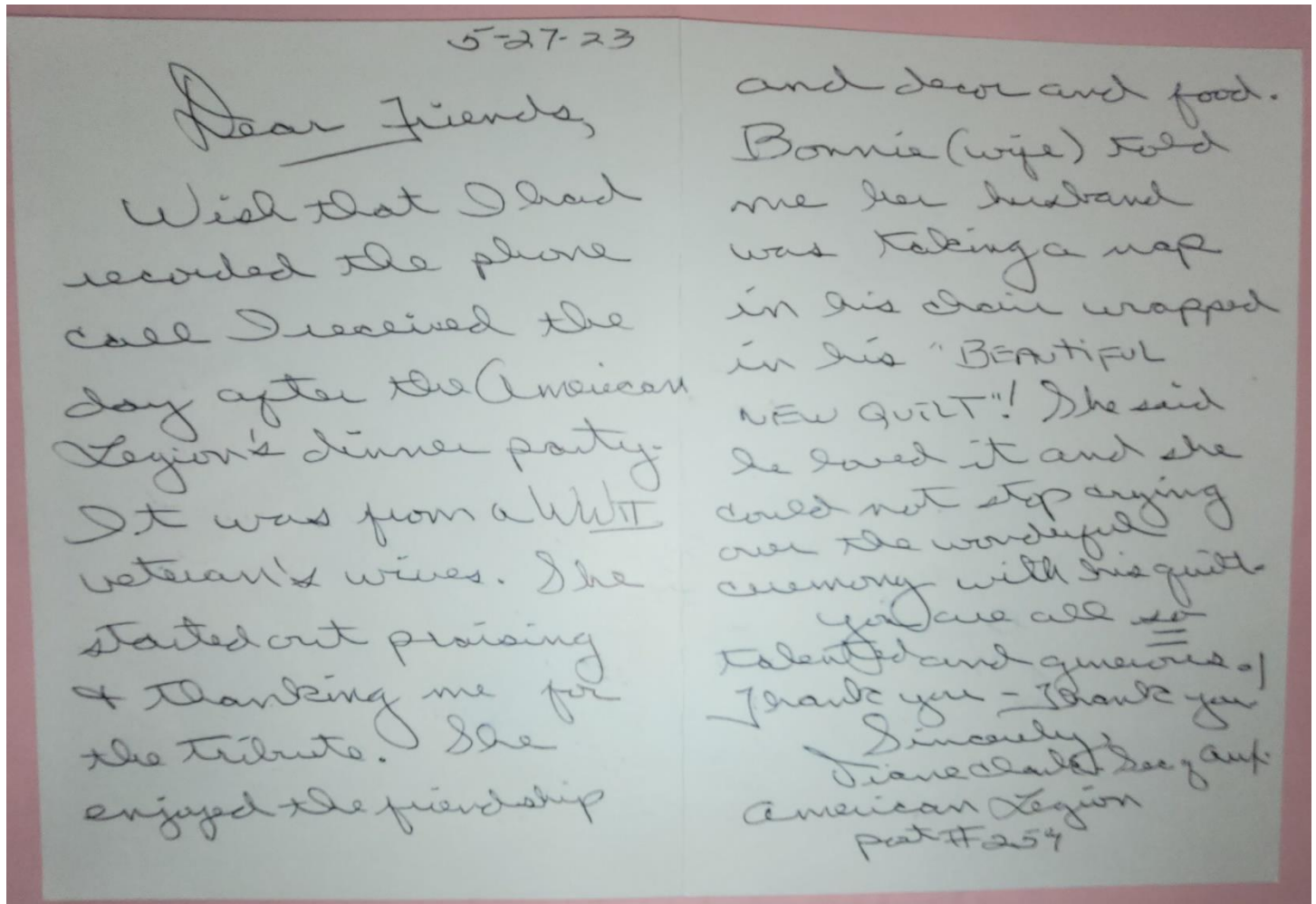
Members rotate to each table to see all of the demonstrations.

Patriotic Quilts Presentation to World War II Veterans

On May 25th, Betty Khzouz, new member Karen Henriksen, and I presented 11 patriotic quilts on behalf of the Crazy Quilters to World War II veterans at the American Legion Post 253 dinner meeting on May 25.

I had been trying to find a way to get quilts to Laguna Woods Village veterans through the American Legion for a couple of years. So, when I read in the Globe that the American Legion was inviting all World War II veterans to be their guests at their meeting, I immediately contacted their secretary, Diane Clark, and suggested this would be the perfect occasion to present patriotic quilts. And this time she agreed!

At first, only 4 WWII veterans had accepted the invitation and we had 6 patriotic quilts in the completed bin. I asked Diane to keep us posted on how many WWII veterans would be at the meeting so they all would be sure to receive a quilt. And our quilters got to work making more quilts. In the few weeks between our initial contact and the meeting, an additional 7 WWII veterans had RSVP'd! But our guild members, particularly Betty, Karen, and Ruth Naomi Buck, rose to the challenge and we ended up with enough for all 11 veterans and a couple extra to boot! It was a very rewarding experience for us and for the veterans, as you can see from the pictures. The only female was an Army Veteran who was 102 years old and was Betty's friend!
