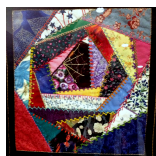

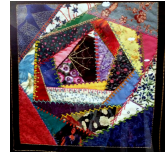

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - By Nancy Allen

Hello Block of the Monthers. A big thank you to you all.

While showing "Reverse Role" (the blue and green quilt) last month, I neglected to especially thank the two girls who put the quilt top together-- Kuniko Hosaka and Ann Ainsworth. Your work is so appreciated.

If I can manage it, you'll get to see the "Plaid" quilt from last month. Only three blocks needed adjusting. A 1/4" foot is a wonderful tool, but the person using it has the brains. If your block is shy of required size, you need to let out seams by a thread or two. If too large, the seam needs to be taken in a thread or two. Sometimes pressing the seams in the opposite direction does the trick. Accuracy is so important when 25 to 30 people are making the blocks for ONE quilt.

A tip or two for keeping fabric edges together without twisted seams. Always add the new strip on the under side, face up. Place your seamed piece face down matching edges and ends. Take a couple of stitches. With needle down it acts as your third hand. Make sure you can see a thread of the under piece all the way to the end. Hang on to the final ends with a solid pinch. If it's a long seam, stop every so often to be sure you can still see that under thread while also keeping the visible seams from twisting. You'll have beautiful seams every time!

I think we'll have stars this month with much lighter colors. It's Spring, after all. Don't forget to pick up your block packet.
