Please return your 10" square block at the March meeting. It can be any design you want – applique, pieced, embroidered or even a 10-inch square of house print fabric would be fun.

Our March Block is a Crumb Quilt block kit. You will be able to pick up this block kit at the March meeting and the 12" square block is due back at the April meeting.

Our April Block is another "free" block that fits the theme BLOOM. There is no kit to pick up. You have access to the Clubhouse 4 fabrics (free of charge) or use fabric from your own stash. Please return your 12" square block at the May meeting. It can be any design you want – applique, pieced, embroidered or even a 12-inch square of print fabric that says BLOOM to you.

At Road to California, our Guild turned in 74 Thomas Fire Blocks to the Ventura Modern Quilt Guild. This count does not include the numerous blocks our Guild members mailed or personally delivered on their own.

In February, we donated six (6) quilts to the Village Social Services Department to provide the newest Friendly Visitors program graduates with a quilt to present to their clients.

February 12th we sent 10 military quilts to the 29 Palms Marine Base. In addition, we also sent 27 pounds (wow!) of beautiful Baby Shower items to 29 Palms, donated by our Guild's Loose Threads Friendship group. These items included Hair Band Blossoms to Travel Changing pads and everything in between and of course, beautiful soft and cuddly blankets and quilts. Thank you so much Loose Threads.

Later this month, we should have 25 to 30 quilts and blankets to deliver to Orangewood Foundation in Santa Ana thanks to a wonderful donation that came in on February 9th. We received some wonderful hand-pieced tops made from gorgeous fun fabric blocks that we will repurpose for twin size and crib quilts. Come to the CH4 quilt room Thursdays from 1-8 or Tuesdays from 4-8 and help us process this generous donation.
