How To Make a Block Press

Once you have made a beautiful quilt block and pressed it ever so nicely, how do you keep it flat and unwrinkled? ...You place it in a quilt block press.

You can make a quilt block press out of fabric and something sturdy like plastic canvas as shown in the attached instructions (including a materials list).
